


	the post service), the delivery takes about 2 weeks to Europe and Americas, and 3 weeks to other destinations.
	Note: If the exchange program is developed on a remote basis, acceptance letters won't be issued for student visa purposes.
Visa Information	All students without Brazilian nationality must hold a student visa or any other visa that enables study in Brazil. For in-person mobility, students without the proper visa (ex.: student, Mercosul, diplomatic) will not be enrolled at PUC-SP.
Enrollment at PUC-SP	During the first two weeks of class, international exchange students will attend the subjects indicated in their study plan, before confirming their final Learning Agreements (at least 15 credits, for student visa purposes). International students cannot be enrolled in subjects that have reached their full capacity.
Credit System	The credit system at PUC-SP is based on the amount of contact hours (per academic semester) of the subject:  68h-72h: 4 credits 51h-54h: 3 credits 34h-36h: 2 credits

C. Practical Information	
Accommodation	PUC-SP is an urban university and doesn't offer its own student accommodation. International students live in private accommodations, generally opting for nearby private student apartments (also called "Repúblicas", in Portuguese) or student residence. The International Office will provide a list of housing options near the university. The main campus is located in the neighborhood of <i>Perdizes</i> .

City of São Paulo	São Paulo is known for its endless skyline of concrete, unreliable weather, multinational companies, heavy traffic, diverse night life, and for hosting many of HE Institutions. For being one of the biggest and most populated cities in the globe, international students should expect a cultural shock.
Neighborhood of <i>Perdizes</i>	Located in the west of São Paulo, Perdizes is one of the best regions of the city. The neighborhood is served with a good transportation system (near two subway stations - Clínicas and Barra Funda), and has all the essential services: supermarkets, banks, drugstores, hospitals, bakeries, open markets, restaurants, movie theaters, gyms, shopping malls, street commerce.  The region also hosts a vibrant cultural life, with a large and important theater (known as TUCA); a Soccer Museum (Museu do Futebol); and the world famous SESC-Pompeia, one of the largest centers of cultural and leisure activities of São Paulo.  Perdizes is also known for its parks and green areas, such as Água Branca Park (good for hiking, being in contact with farm animals and having a nice picnic); Zilda Natel Park (a favorite among the skaters); and the bike lanes that cross the main avenue in the region, Av. Sumaré.  It also has a rich and varied gastronomy, with pizzerias, Japanese food, vegetarian and vegan restaurants, burger places, «self-service» restaurants, bars, and all that is good in a megalopolis.
Safety	Despite the notion of São Paulo being an unsafe city, incidents rarely occur to our cautious international students. Students are oriented to stay alert in the city, and to never display their valuables or react against aggressors while in public venues.
Vaccination	Vaccination against <u>Covid-19, Yellow Fever, Dengue, and Measles</u> are recommended.


# D. Living Expenses in São Paulo

São Paulo is considered a very expensive city compared to Brazilian and Latin American standards. Prices may vary depending on the neighborhood or individual habits of the student.

Accommodation	Prices of rooms in shared private apartments near the main campus might vary from R\$ 1800 to R\$ 3500 per month. Added services (pool, gym, etc.) greatly influence in the price of the accommodations.
Public Transportation	Bus and subway tickets cost R\$ 5,00 and R\$ 5,20 (each trip), respectively. The system can be integrated by using the smartcard "Bilhete Único". This smartcard allows riders to discounted prices for multiple rides (including all means of public transportation) and facilitates transitions between transit systems. It can be purchased after foreigner's registration procedure at Federal Police.
Textbooks & Class Material	R\$ 200 to R\$ 350 per semester (estimated cost). In some courses at PUC-SP, students make photocopies of the material used in class. This cost is estimated for courses that heavily rely on photocopies and have a relatively large amount of reading.
Food	R\$ 600 to R\$ 1000 per month. May vary according to the personal habits of the student. University restaurant: a meal costs approximately R\$18.
Federal Police Fees	R\$ 204,77, for mandatory registration process.  www.gov.br/pf/pt-br/assuntos/imigracao/registrar-se-como- estrangeiro-no-brasil/registro-de-imigrante-detentor-de-visto
Pocket Money	R\$ 500 to R\$ 1000 per month. May vary according to the personal habits of the student.
