Living in Savoie



The Université Savoie Mont-Blanc (USMB) has been awarded the “**Welcome To France**” label, and organizes numerous activities to help students find their way around Annecy and Chambéry, including the integration seminar in Courchevel, the Welcome Party, the Chambéry International Fair: “Tour du monde au Manège”, and a monthly visit (hikes, visits to tourist sites, outings to theme parks).



Finding accommodation can be tricky, the university welcome center provides assistance (accommodation form to send after receiving the acceptance letter) when finding an accommodation, please note that the CROUS has some option available for students, but not guaranteed.



The départements of Savoie and Haute-Savoie are in the heart of the Alps, with ski resorts nearby and the lakes of Annecy and Bourget to enjoy on warmer days. The region's proximity to Italy and Geneva makes it the ideal place to study and benefit from international mobility.



You can arrive to Annecy and Chambéry by plane from Geneva or Lyon airport (Chambéry airport is only opened during winter season).

Both cities are accessible by bus or train (Flixbus, or SNCF)

To travel within the cities, they each have their own network system (SIBRA for Annecy, and SYNCHRO for Chambéry)

You can have regional trains half prices with the “Illico jeune” subscription available at the train station



No fee if the students have the European Health Card Insurance, non- European students can benefit from the French health cover. 16€ for the civil liability (compulsory for all students)

Students might need a supplementary health insurance with their EHIC since only 70% of any medical act is refunded in France. They can apply upon arrival (first price is 11€/month)

Price of a medical consultation is 30€

Estimated costs per months : 860 €



Student residence : 350 €

Housing insurance: about 40€ for 1 year

Transport Mobility card: Carte OURA 5€

Bus SYNCHRO: 22€ a month

Food and miscellaneous: 450 €

The University also provide a welcome kit for incoming students, to grant them access to local, cultural or outdoor activities.
