


APPLICATION PROCESS



To become an exchange student at MDU, the first step is to be nominated by your home university. Once we have accepted the nomination, we will send you information about the application and our list of courses.

The next step is the online application, the details will be explained in this Application Guide. You have to fill in your information, your current studies, upload your Transcript of records and select your courses.

You'll find information about our courses in the Course Guide. You can choose any courses you want to as long as you meet the eligibility requirements and the courses don't collide schedule wise.

The assessment of your application begins officially the day after the application deadline. We will go through your application and will contact you if you have to change/add something.

The Admissions Office will issue a "Letter of Anticipated Participation" (your admission letter) and send it to you via email. Once you have received it, you can start with the practicalities; accommodation, student visa etc.

Application for Exchange Students

Please note that you do not need to complete your application all at once. At any point in the process, you can save the information and be able to complete it later. Remember to click on the "save your progress" button for every page you complete!

There are seven sections in the application that you will need to complete:

- 3. Educational background and requested stay
- 4. Learning agreement / Course selection
- 5. Language skills
- 6. Declaration of consent
- 7. Submit application



ONLINE APPLICATION – STEP BY STEP


STEP 1: Personal Information

In this section, you need to provide all your basic information. Based on the information you provide in this section, we will issue the Letter of Admission that you will use (if needed) to apply for a residence permit.



STEP 2: Emergency Contact

We strongly recommend that you provide us with the contact information of a family member.




The relationship between you and your contact person, for example "Mother" or "Husband".


If you want to add more than one Emergency Contact.



STEP 3: Educational Background and Requested Stay



You are required to upload your **Transcript of Records**. Make sure that the transcript is in English and have ECTS credits or equivalent.




If you are a master level student, please upload the transcript of records for your bachelor studies as well.

You have to upload a certificate that shows your current courses (for spring 2024) with course title and the number of credits. Please use the document "Certificate of current studies" provided through the link.

STEP 4: Learning Agreement / Course selection


In this section, you will be required to list the courses you wish to study during your exchange. If your university requires a Learning Agreement, we will sign it after the assessment process has been completed.

Make sure that your chosen courses don't collide schedule wise. You find all information about our courses in the Course guide or on our website.



STEP 5: Language Skills

Here you will be required to provide us with information about your language skills. You have to confirm that you have sufficient knowledge to follow lectures in English.




As an exchange student, you are exempted from submitting a language test result/certificate. However, you are expected to hold level B2 as per the Common European Framework (CEFR) for languages:

| Spoken interaction | You can interact with a degree of fluency and spontaneity that makes regular interaction with native speakers quite possible. You can take an active part in discussion in familiar contexts, accounting for and sustaining your views. |
|-----------------------|---|
| Spoken production | You can present clear, detailed descriptions on a wide range of subjects related to your field of interest. You can explain a viewpoint on a topical issue giving the advantages and disadvantages of various options. |
| Listening | You can understand extended speech and lectures and follow even complex lines of argument provided the topic is reasonably familiar. You can understand most TV news and current affairs programs. You can understand the majority of films in standard dialect. |
| Writing | You can write clear, detailed text on a wide range of subjects related to my interests. You can write an essay or report, passing on information or giving reasons in support of or against a particular point of view. You can write letters highlighting the personal significance of events and experiences. |
| Reading | You can read articles and reports concerned with contemporary problems in which the writers adopt particular attitudes or viewpoints. You can understand contemporary literary prose. |

STEP 6: Declaration of Consent

In this section you just need to read the statements and declare your consent.



STEP 7: Submit Application

This is the final step. Make sure you have completed all mandatory fields, uploaded the right documents and that all information are correct. No changes will be possible after submitting the application.

LETTER OF ADMISSION

Once we have concluded the assessment of your application and confirmed that you meet the eligibility requirements for your chosen courses the Admissions Office will issue your "Letter of Anticipated Participation" (Letter of admission). You will receive it through email. Please note that no hard copy of the letter will be sent.

The Letters of admission will be sent as follows:

FALL SEMESTER 2024

| 4 June 2024 | For applicants from outside the EU/EEA area |

| 17-18 June 2024 | For applicants within the Erasmus+ exchange program |

SPRING SEMESTER 2025

| 7 November 2024 | For applicants from outside the EU/EEA area |

AFTER THE ADMISSION

Once you have received the document "Certificate of Anticipated Participation" – Congratulations! It means that you are admitted to studies at Mälardalen University.

Now it is time for you to start with all the practicalities.

Residence permit

If you need a residence permit to study in Sweden, please apply as soon as possible after you receive your letter of admission. The time to decision for a residence permit can be 3-4 months.

Accommodation

MDU collaborates with a housing agency, to make it easier for you as a student to find accommodation. The housing agency we collaborate with is called Bostad Västerås. There are various kinds of housing types available, but the most common is small studio apartments. Once you have received your Letter of admission, you can register through the website of Bostad Västerås. Provided that there are vacancies you will get a housing offer through email. Accepting this (potential) offer is highly recommended, since it can be hard to find accommodation in Västerås on your own.
