Exchange vs Study Abroad

Exchange

Inbound (one or two semesters)

The Student Exchange Program is available for students enrolled at one of our partner universities. Approved exchange students currently enrolled at one of our partner universities receive a tuition fee waiver for their international exchange program and do not pay fees to Swinburne under the agreed reciprocal exchange arrangement. To study at Swinburne as an exchange student, you must be nominated by one of Swinburne's partner universities.

Study Abroad

Inbound (one or two semesters)

The Study Abroad Program is available to students enrolled at a university, at a partner or non-partner university. Students can study at Swinburne on a fee-paying basis for one or two semesters, and can choose to undertake 3 or 4 units. Students enrolled in a Study Abroad program are charged a Study Abroad Fee for the program.

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How to apply

Exchange Application

Eligibility

To be eligible for the exchange program you must have successfully completed one year of study at a higher education institution and meet all entry requirements. You can find more information here. Your home university may also have their own entry requirements for the Exchange Program.

How to apply

Students will need to contact their home institution to be nominated as a candidate for the Exchange program at Swinburne. Only students who have an approved nomination will be able to submit an application.

Study Abroad Application

Eligibility

To be eligible for the Study Abroad program you must have tuition fees completed Australian Year 12 or equivalent. Find more information here.

Tuition fees (2024 rates)*

A\$10,400 per semester for 4 units A\$7,800 per semester for 3 units.

Study Abroad application deadline

Semester 1 (February-June): 22 January Semester 2 (July-November): 18 June

Applications will only be accepted after the deadlines above on a caseby-case basis.

For Study Abroad and Exchange programs, students may provide an official letter from their home university stating that they meet English requirements equivalent to B2 of the Common European Framework.

*Note: English language proficiency documents can be no more than three years prior to commencing studies at Swinburne (and no more than five years for students from Germany, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Finland, Iceland, Austria, Netherlands, and Switzerland)

Application Tips

Developing your study plan: You will need to find and select the classes (units) you wish to study at Swinburne. You must nominate at least 8 units at the time of application for assessment.

Search for units: You can search for units and get a detailed unit description by using the single unit search engine.

You can also browse through our courses or search by study area here.

It is the student's responsibility to make sure that the classes/units chosen will be credited back to their home university.

Please note: Swinburne Abroad and Admissions staff are not able to provide any information or advice about visas. Students will need to contact the Department of Home Affairs directly with any enquiries: www.homeaffairs.gov.au.

More information

Study Load

International students are required to take a full-time study load per semester for Visa purposes.

- the **minimum** full-time study load is 37.5 credit points
- the maximum full-time study load is 50 credit points. Most units of study (but not all) equal 12.5 credits, so students may study 3 classes or 4 classes per semester, across all Swinburne study areas. Students can mix and match classes to suit their needs, as long as they meet the required prerequisites for the classes they choose.

Health Insurance

All international students on a student visa must have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) as part of Australian visa regulations. This cover provides medical and hospital insurance. You and your dependents must maintain suitable OSHC for the duration of your visa. Swinburne can arrange this Health Cover on student's behalf. For more information, visit our website.
