LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

students.

ACCOMMODATIONS

There are different types of housing available at Washington College. Most residence halls have shared rooms and bathrooms. Below is a list of the types of residence halls.

Residence Hall Type – Traditional Style, Male Only: Cecil and Dorchester Talbot (any gender)

Rooms - Single and double rooms available

Bathrooms – Shared bathrooms by suite

Description – The residence halls have both males and females living on the same floor and in some cases in the same suite. Each suite has 3-6 residents. The bathrooms are shared by the suite.

Description – The residence halls have both males and females. There are large bathrooms with showers, toilet stalls, and sinks per floor. Cullen bathrooms are designated by gender. Reid Hall rooms and bathrooms are gender inclusive.

VISA PROCESS

Students must obtain a **student visa** before they enter the U.S. Students will receive a **DS2019** in their acceptance packets from Washington College, and should refer to the acceptance packet for instructions on the **J-1 visa** process. Students must first pay the **I-901 fee <u>prior</u>** to their appointment with the U.S. Embassy in their home country.
