EXCHANGE SEMESTER

NOMINATION AND APPLICATION

- The partner institution selects eligible students and sends us their contact information through our online system. An email is sent to each partner when the system opens.
- The students receive an email inviting them to fill out an application form for the exchange semester. All of the required documents must be provided at this step.
- The students receive their official letter of admission by email.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE DATES

ARRIVAL

Students must arrive a few days before the start of the semester in order to become familiar with their new environment and attend the Welcome Days. No arrivals after the start of the semester will be accepted.



Departure must be after the exam period is completed. The exact exam dates are posted during the first week of the semester. It is therefore recommended that students not book a return flight before then.

WELCOME DAYS AND BUDDY PROGRAM

Students are required to attend the Welcome Days. They take place just before classes start and are crucial for the students' academic, cultural and social integration.

International students can ask to be paired with a "buddy" if they wish. The Student Buddy Program provides new international students with a helping hand to settle in and adapt to campus and Québec life during the first few weeks of the semester.





COURSES

Case studies, simulations, debates, oral presentations, practical assignments, meetings with business leaders... Our pedagogical approach based on practice prepares students to meet the challenges they will face in the world of management. As a Canadian leader in techno-pedagogy, FSA ULaval offers students a variety of technological tools so they can play an active role in their education.

LANGUAGES OF INSTRUCTION

French and English

LANGUAGE **REQUIREMENTS**

To be admitted in a management course given in French, students must provide proof of French proficiency:

- a score of at least 860/990 on the TFI;
- a score of at least C1 on the DELF or TCF.

Proof of proficiency must be submitted along with the application or during course selection, at the latest.

Partners are responsible for ensuring student fluency in English. Students without adequate English proficiency run the risk of failing the courses.

WORKLOAD

Students must take 4 or 5 courses per semester. Master's students who take 5 courses should expect a considerable workload.

Generally speaking, 1 course is equivalent to 3 credits (6 ECTS) and requires:

- 3 consecutive classroom hours per week;
- 6 hours of individual study per week (reading, preparation, teamwork, exercises, etc.).

By enrolling in 4 courses, students can therefore expect 36 hours of classes and studies per week. By enrolling in 5 courses, they can expect 45 hours of classes and studies per week.

GRADE REQUIREMENTS

FSA ULaval does not have any minimum average requirements for exchange students, but they must satisfy the requirements of their home university.

COURSE SELECTION

Course selection is carried out in May for the fall semester and in November for the winter semester. An email is sent to each student with instructions.

Some courses have prerequisites. Before enrolling in these courses, students must have passed courses that are equivalent to these prerequisites. View the list of management courses.

Students may take up to 2 courses offered by another faculty. Most of the courses at other faculties are given in French.

Students may also take **language courses**. All language courses are included in the total number of credits allowed per semester as part of the exchange.

French as a Second Language Courses

- French as a second language (FLS) are tuition-free. However, a \$100 pedagogical fee per course will be charged to students. In order to be placed in the right level, all students are required to take an online placement test.
- 5-week intensive French courses are also offered during the summer for students attending the fall semester or enrolling for a full year.

Other Foreign Language Courses

Université Laval offers many other language courses such as Chinese, German, Italian, Japanese, Portuguese, Spanish and Russian.

TRANSCRIPTS

In compliance with Canada's Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act, transcripts are mailed directly to students and not to institutions at the end of the semester.

Students then have the option of providing their copy to their home university or ordering a second copy at their own expense (\$10).



HOUSING

Université Laval has 4 residence buildings on its campus, of which 3 are co-ed and 1 for women only. Every year, more than 2,300 students choose to live there.

A certain number of rooms in the student residences are reserved each semester for exchange students. We send students a reservation form they have to fill out and send to the Service des résidences to reserve a room.

LIVING AND PROSPECTIVE COSTS (CANS)

\$6,000\$-\$8,000/SEMESTER

Food: around \$425/month

Housing: around \$380/month (in residence)

Off-campus housing: around \$350 to \$800/month depending on location and whether sharing cost with others

Insurance: around \$300/semester (mandatory for international students)

Leisure and other expenses: around \$400/month

HEALTH INSURANCE

All international students are automatically covered by the Université Laval group health and hospitalization insurance plan. This coverage is mandatory and costs around \$300 per semester.

It cannot be replaced by any personal **insurance**. Students from countries with which the Québec government has entered into a reciprocal social security agreement may be exempt.



STUDENT WORK PERMITS

Students who hold a valid study permit are authorized to work up to 20 hours per week outside the campus and an unlimited number of hours on campus. A service is available to help students find work.

Exchange students have free access to the swimming pools, indoor and outdoor jogging tracks and skating rinks at the PEPS (webpage in French only), Université Laval's sports complex. They also benefit from preferential membership rates for the gym, which is renowned for its ultramodern equipment.
