

FACULTY OF HEALTH

Université Paris Cité is divided in three Faculties (Humanities and Social Sciences, Sciences, Health) and one Institute (Institut de Physique du Globe de Paris). Each Faculty is divided into Departments (UFR, IUT).

1. APPLICATION

Deadlines

FIRST SEMESTER OR FULL YEAR APPLICATION

Nomination: April 30th

Application: May 15th

SECOND SEMESTER APPLICATION

Nomination: October 15th

Application: October 30th

Application step by step

STEP 1: NOMINATION

Selected students must be officially nominated by the International Office of their home institution by sending an email to the Departments (contact email below). Nominations made by students themselves won't be accepted. Nomination must include the following information:

- Last name
- First name
- Date of birth
- Email address
- Field of study
- Current level of study
- Level of study during mobility
- Starting semester (1st or 2nd)
- Length of study (one or two semesters)
- Department being nominated for (see list below)

STEP 2: ONLINE APPLICATION

Once nominated, students will receive an "Application Kit" with the following items:

- Guidelines (MoveOn platform application link, instructions)
- Learning agreement templates (Erasmus and non-Erasmus)
- Agenda and mobility contacts

All the application process is digital. Students must submit their MoveOn application form with all required documents online by the deadline indicated above.

Students will have to include in their application a learning agreement approved by their academic contact at UPCité

Students must indicate a valid e-mail address in the form (avoid Hotmail, live, qq.com and 163.com accounts).

STEP 3: MOBILITY PREPARATION

If accepted, students will receive by the end of June a "Welcome Kit" with the following items:

- A **Welcome Guide** with the different administrative paths to follow
- An **acceptance letter**
- Information about the **Welcome webinars** (life in Paris, university registration, housing, health...): between June and July for arrivals in the first semester, early December for arrivals in the second semester
- Information about the **Welcome Week**: mid-September for arrivals in the first semester, mid-January for arrivals in the second semester.
- Information about the **Buddy Programme**

GRADING SCALE

The grading system in France is based on a numbered scale from 0 to 20, with 20 as the highest possible grade. 10 is the minimum passing grade. If a student does not get a passing grade, they will have to retake exams (rattrapage)

Languages
LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

Students must have a language proficiency for the courses they wish to enrol in and will need a certificate to prove it except for native speakers. The academic contact holds the right to accept or refuse the enrolment of any student based on their language proficiency.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE

We do not require a minimum level of English for incoming medical students in Health

FRENCH AS A FOREIGN LANGUAGE LESSONS

French as a foreign language (FLE) are courses available throughout the year for all students at the LANSAD (<https://u-paris.fr/eila/lansad/>) and CdL departments (<https://u-paris.fr/centres-de-langues/>). Please note that international students may only take 2 FLE courses per semester (one workshop and one grammar course).

TRANSCRIPT OF RECORD

The transcript of records will be sent by email to the home university and to the student:

- By the end of February for student ending their mobility on the first semester
- By the end of July for students ending their mobility on the second semester (or full year students)

4. GENERAL INFORMATION

Housing

UNIVERSITY STUDENT HOUSING

Université Paris Cité only has a few rooms in several residences in Paris (also called CROUS). As a consequence, **we cannot guarantee housing for all students.**

Accommodations in CROUS residences are equipped with a kitchenette, bathroom facilities and internet access. All students at a CROUS residence will be eligible for financial housing aid provided by the French State.

While applying after their nomination, students will have the option to ask for accommodation provided by UPCité. A commission will review the applications and decide about housing placements (by the end of June for the 1st semester/by December for the 2nd semester). A housing application form will be sent to the selected students and will have to be submitted by the deadline to confirm housing.

OTHER HOUSING POSSIBILITIES

We recommend to be wary of other platforms, as often many of the listings featured are scams. Beware of any accommodation listing that asks an upfront deposit through Western Union.

Rent (€): around €800/month for a studio apartment, around €600/month for a shared flat. Those prices apply in Paris, the suburban area is cheaper

Transport fares (€): €86,40/month for Paris

N.B. Students under 26 can benefit from a discount pass ("Imagin'R") for €38/month.

HEALTH INSURANCE

International students have access to the French national healthcare system.

A complementary insurance is highly recommended.

The French healthcare system will be further explained during the Welcome Webinars and the Welcome Guide conferences.

EUROPEAN STUDENTS

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Students must get their European Health Insurance Card before arriving in France and must be valid during their entire exchange.

The French healthcare system is free for international students.

N.B: Non-European students who do not have access to the European card will have to proceed as international students. British students can get a European Health Insurance Card, but MUST have their resident permits.
