ACADEMIC INFORMATION	
Courses at the Department of Romance Studies and Classics	The department offers courses with French, Spanish, Italian and Portuguese as language of instruction at Bachelor and Master level. Some courses are given with English as language of instruction as well - in Romance Languages (Advanced level) and Latin American Studies.
	The incoming student is required to choose a minimum of 7,5 ECTS at the Department of Romance Studies and Classics. www.su.se/romklass/courses

Course catalogue Stockholm	The student can narrow down the search by using filters, ex: choose semester, area of studies, level – ex: 1 st level (Bachelor) - 2 nd level, (Master), language of instruction etc.

Choice of courses	After receiving the Application Form, the departmental coordinator will contact the various Departments responsible for each course, to check if the student is eligible to the course.	
	The departmental coordinator at Romklass will inform the student as soon as possible.	
Courses	Normally 7,5, 15 or 30 credits.	
	Students can choose 1 course 30 credits, or two courses 15 credits courses, or four 7.5 credit courses - or any other combination.	
	 Courses can be offered daytime or late afternoon/evening. Courses 7,5 – 15 credits are sometimes offered at slower pace 25-50%. The workload is estimated to 40 hours per week for fulltime-studies (30 ECTS) including lectures, readings, assignments, seminars and independen studies. All courses at SU have got a course plan, that states content, eligibility, examinations etc. Unfortunately, not all course plans are available in English. For questions regarding eligibility and choice of courses please contact the department coordinator at the Department of Romance Studies and Classics. 	
Choice of courses – practical information	 The semester is divided into 2 periods, each period consists of 10 weeks of studies. Preferably the student should choose 15 ECTS in each period. Period 1 is divided into A and B, and period 2 is divided into C and D - by some departments. The student should avoid choosing all courses during the same period. This may cause problems e.g. with workload, schedules and exams. 	
Application Periods	 Courses starting autumn semester – application spring Courses starting spring semester – application autumn 	
	 Students staying a whole academic year can carry out a <u>preliminary</u> choice for the 2nd semester. The departmental coordinator will contact the student in September/October for the choice of courses for spring. 	
Required credits/ECTS	 Exchange students are supposed to take 30 credits/semester which is considered studies at 100%. 	
Examination	 Examinations are arranged throughout the year with no fixed examination periods. Most often one re-take of an examination is offered within the course period, or shortly after.

Application procedure - Housing	The Departmental coordinator at the Department of Romance Studies and Classics will send the student's contact information (e-mail) to the Housing Office.	
riousing	 The Housing Office will then contact all students by e-mail in mid/late May (arrival autumn) mid/late October (arrival spring) to inform about how to apply for housing. 	
	NB Since the housing situation in Stockholm is rather difficult, please note that we cannot guarantee housing for all students.	
	However, students not receiving housing at first will be placed on a waiting list, and will also receive information from the Housing Office how to search for alternatives.	
Insurance	All incoming exchange students are covered by Kammarkollegiet's Student IN-insurance, by the Swedish state during the time that they are registered on courses as exchange students at Stockholm University. Please note that this insurance is only valid when being in Sweden. For any travels during the study period in other countries, it is recommended that students have a private insurance.
