### **Art History and Art Business at Regent's**

#### In autumn you could take:

#### **Renaissance Art and Society**

With classes in the National Gallery, V&A and a session making egg tempera paint and using Renaissance drawing materials (see top photo)

#### **Art Business**

Find out more about aspects of Art Business including art fairs, auctions, commercial galleries and private and corporate collecting. We visit Frieze Art Fair (see bottom photo) that takes place on our doorstep in Regent's Park as well as auctions and private collections.

#### Art in the Age of Revolution

Visit the Wallace Collection, National Gallery, Tate and the Courtauld to explore art from Rococo to Impressionism.

#### **Twentieth Century Modernisms**

Engage with cross-disciplinary issues relevant to

Modernism, including gender and sexuality, colonialism, the 'other' and the self, and examine how artists responded to the representation of these issues. Visits to Tate Modern, the Estorick Collection and other galleries will be included.

#### **Situating Art**

Explore how art functions in distinct social, cultural, economic and political contexts.





### Media and Communications at Regent's

In Autumn you could take:

#### **Media Histories and Futures**

With field trips to the Brands Museum, the Postal Museum and the Science Museum (see top photo)

#### **Digital Media and Society**

Experiment with VR, make podcasts and enjoy an immersive experience (see bottom photo)

#### **Global Media Industries**

Includes a visit to the BBC in Cardiff

#### **Interpreting Media**

Examine and interpret a variety of media texts, including news, film, television, advertising, popular music, video games and online content

#### **Media Ethics and Policy**

Critically analyse the ethical, legal, political and environmental challenges in media and communications.

- Nomination from home institution (~ 4 months in advance)
- Receive application link and instructions from Regent's University London
- Fill out online application: upload a copy of your academic transcript and passport and select your modules
- Receive offer and accept
