SEMESTER ABROAD Exchange (Erasmus+ Overseas)



The Exchange programme (Erasmus+ & Overseas) allows Università Cattolica students to apply for a semester or an academic year abroad at one of the European destinations within the Erasmus+ network or at one of the non-European Overseas partner universities.



When to apply

Applications open twice a year: in October/November for departures in the 1st semester of the following academic year, and in March/April for departures in the 2nd semester.



Who can apply

All Università Cattolica students enrolled at the time of application and departure* are eligible. The number of places available for each destination is limited, and selection is based on the merit ranking defined by each Faculty.



Where can I go

Discover all available destinations on our website or on the last pages of this brochure.



Recognition of exams/credits

Exams taken abroad can be officially recognised in your study plan.



Costs & scholarships

Scholarships are available for all participants. Exchange students are exempt from paying tuition fees at the host university. All living costs abroad remain the responsibility of the student.



Language requirements

Each destination has its own language requirement, which must be met at the time of application.

SEMESTER ABROAD

Study Abroad



The Study Abroad programme allows Università Cattolica students to spend a semester or a full academic year at some of the most prestigious universities around the world.



When to apply

Applications open twice a year: in October/November for departures in the 1st semester of the following academic year, and in March/April for departures in the 2nd semester.



Who can apply

All Università Cattolica students enrolled at the time of application and departure* are eligible. The number of places for most destinations is unlimited.



Where can I go

Discover all available destinations on our website or on the last pages of this brochure.



Recognition of exams/credits

Exams taken abroad can be officially recognised in your study plan.



Costs & scholarships

Scholarships are available for all participants, subject to availability of funds.

Study Abroad students are required to pay an academic fee for the programme abroad, which varies depending on the destination, in addition to the costs related to their stay.

Each destination has its own language requirement, which must be met at the time of application.

SEMESTER ABROAD

ISEP Exchange



Università Cattolica is part of the ISEP Exchange network, which offers students the opportunity to study around the world through more than 150 destinations.



When to apply

Applications open twice a year: in October/November for departures in the 1st semester of the following academic year, and in March/April for departures in the 2nd semester.



Who can apply

All Università Cattolica students enrolled at the time of application and departure* are eligible. A limited number of students can be selected each semester.



Where can I go

Discover all available destinations on our website or on the last pages of this brochure.



Recognition of exams/credits

Exams taken abroad can be officially recognised in your study plan.



Costs & scholarships

Scholarships are available for all participants, subject to availability of funds.

Students taking part in the ISEP Exchange programme are required to pay a fee of €6,000 (updated for the academic year 2025/26), which includes tuition fees for the semester abroad as well as room and board on campus. Some additional expenses remain the responsibility of the student – please check the detailed information on the programme webpage.



Language requirements

SEMESTER ABROAD

Free Mover



The Free Mover programme allows students to apply to universities (both within and outside Europe) that have an Erasmus+ or Overseas agreement with their Faculty, and spend a semester studying at the selected host university.

Through the Free Mover programme, students can choose the courses that interest them from the host university's academic offer, request official recognition of the exams as equivalent at Università Cattolica, and access all university services, just like Exchange (Erasmus+ & Overseas) students.



When to apply

Applications open twice a year, following the publication of the Exchange (Erasmus+ & Overseas) ranking lists.



Where can I go

Potential destinations are the same as those for the Exchange (Erasmus+ & Overseas) programme, but not all partners accept Free Movers. Please follow the guidelines in the programme regulations to identify available destinations.



Requirements

There are no specific prerequisites for this programme, but students must meet the admission criteria set by the host university.



Costs

Tuition fees and all living expenses abroad are the responsibility of the student.



DOUBLE DEGREES

These programmes allow students to complete part of their academic studies at Università Cattolica and part at a partner university abroad, obtaining a degree recognised both in Italy and in the host country.

This highly international qualification ensures strong language skills and excellent employability prospects in a global job market.

IELTS Preparation Courses

Why prepare for an IELTS certification?

Because international certifications are required for admission to undergraduate and postgraduate programmes in Italy and abroad, as well as for public competitions

Because international certifications allow you to apply for Cattolica International programmes and may give you a higher ranking score

Because achieving a good score requires a specific course designed to prepare you for the exam



IELTS PREPARATION COURSES

Available in person/online



Cattolica International offers English language courses designed to prepare students for the international IELTS certification. Obtaining this certification allows you to apply for international programmes.



Who can apply

The courses are open to all students and recent graduates (up to 12 months after graduation) from all Faculties.



When to apply

Application deadlines vary depending on the course format (semester or intensive):
September–November and January–May.



When do courses take place

Courses are offered in two formats and are available both in the first and second semester:

- **Semester course:** two lessons per week, for a total of 40 contact hours. Courses start in September and February.
- **Intensive course:** two lessons per week for one month, for a total of 32 contact hours.



Key Benefits

- **Flexibility:** courses are offered both online and in person
- **Intensive learning:** a real boost for your English
- **Interaction:** constant engagement with your teacher and classmates
- **Skill development:** deepen your English knowledge and acquire the specific skills you need to succeed in the IELTS exam: Listening, Reading, Writing & Speaking

LANGUAGE COURSES ABROAD

Customised Courses – Keiron Education

Available in person / online

In collaboration with Keiron Education, an agency specialising in guidance and organisation of language courses, Cattolica International helps you choose the language course abroad that best suits your needs.

Courses available in: **English, French, German, Spanish**

Who can apply

Open to all students and recent graduates (up to 12 months after graduation) from all Faculties.

When to apply

Applications are always open, and you can register up to one month before departure. Check the website or contact Keiron Education at info@keiron-education.com to book an appointment and select the most suitable language course for you.

Chinese Language Courses – BLCU

Available in person

This programme allows students to attend Chinese language courses for international students at the Beijing Language and Culture University.

Who can apply

Open to all students and recent graduates (up to 12 months after graduation) from all Faculties.

When to apply

The programme is offered three times a year. Applications must be submitted approximately 3 months before the desired start date:

- For courses starting in September/November: apply by May
- For courses starting in June/July/August: apply by March
- For courses starting in March/April: apply by the previous November

Start dates and programme duration

Choose your preferred start date and course duration (from 2 weeks to 6 months).

Key Benefits

- Courses available at **all levels**, from beginner to advanced
- **Standard or intensive courses**, individual or group, online or in person
- **Preparation** for international certifications
- Courses **tailored to your Faculty**
- Option to book **different types of accommodation**

Start dates and programme duration

Courses last between 1 and 4 months (student's choice) and start in March, April, July, August, September, and November.

- **Standard or intensive courses**, small classes, interactive teaching methods



SUMMER PROGRAMMES

Available in person

Summer Programmes offer the opportunity to spend from 2 to 8 weeks abroad during the summer. At one of our partner universities, you will be able to select courses and request official recognition of your exams.



Who can apply

Open to all students and recent graduates (up to 12 months after graduation) from all Faculties.



When to apply

Applications open: from December for some programmes and from January for all destinations.

Applications close: deadlines vary depending on the destination and generally fall between February and April.



Start dates and programme duration

Start dates and programme duration vary depending on the destination, but all courses run between May and August and last between 2 and 8 weeks.



Key Benefits

- **Scholarships available**, awarded on the basis of academic merit, for all destinations
- A unique opportunity to experience a **top-tier university** such as: Stanford, Harvard, Yale, UCLA, UC Berkeley, London School of Economics and many more
- **Intensive programmes** that allow you to earn credits in just a few weeks and get ahead in your study plan
- **All-inclusive package**: support during the application process, courses, official transcript with grades, and for some programmes, room and board
- **TOEFL and IELTS** are not always mandatory



Specialised Programme at Boston University in Interactive Marketing Communication, Public Relations and Events Management

Open to students from all Faculties, but primarily aimed at students in the following study areas, for which extra ECTS credits are awarded:

- Interfaculty Arts and Philosophy / Economics / Political and Social Science
- Linguistic Sciences and Foreign Literatures
- Political and Social Sciences – recommended for students in the "Scienze della Comunicazione" or "Comunicazione pubblica" curriculum
- Psychology – recommended for students in the "Organizzazione e Marketing" curriculum



INTERNATIONAL VOLUNTEERING

Available in person



The International Volunteering programme allows you to take part first-hand in cooperation, development, and support projects within local communities.

Destinations include Europe, Asia, Africa, and Latin America.



Who can apply

Open to all students and recent graduates (up to 12 months after graduation) from all Faculties.

No previous volunteering experience is required, but you must demonstrate a good knowledge of English. A language certificate is not mandatory.



When to apply

Applications are **open** from November to March.



Start dates and programme duration

Projects can last 2, 3, or 4 weeks, depending on your choice, with departures in July and August.



Key Benefits

- Depending on your studies and interests, you can **choose the area** of volunteering:
 - » Childcare & Teaching
 - » Community & Women's Development
 - » Environmental & Wildlife Conservation
 - » Health Education
 - » Sustainable Agriculture
- **Scholarships available**, awarded on the basis of academic merit
- The programme can be **recognised** as a **curricular internship**
- The cost of the programme includes a **full package**: pre-departure orientation and support, assistance during the registration phase, 24/7 emergency number during your stay, local coordinator, airport pick-up service, accommodation, health insurance for the entire programme duration, Safety App, and participation certificate
- International volunteering is a unique opportunity to **challenge yourself** and **enrich your CV** with an authentic and meaningful experience

THESIS ABROAD

Available in person



The Thesis Abroad programme offers scholarships to support students (Bachelor's and Master's) from all Faculties who have independently identified an international opportunity to carry out research in preparation for their final thesis.



Who can apply

Open to students completing their Bachelor's or Master's degree in any Faculty and campus.

To apply, students must provide:

- A document confirming the thesis topic has been submitted
- A reference letter from their Università Cattolica supervisor on official letterhead
- An acceptance letter from the host institution



When to apply

Applications are always open, but must be completed at least one month before the planned start date.



Start dates and programme duration

There are no fixed dates: students can leave whenever they wish, after agreeing on timing with their Università Cattolica supervisor and the host institution.



Key Benefits

- **Flexibility**: there is no predefined list of destinations. Each student, in agreement with their Università Cattolica supervisor, can choose the destination best suited to their thesis research (universities, libraries, research institutes, NGOs, companies).
- **Quick start**: the programme can be set up quickly, allowing students to include an international research experience before graduation.
- **Scholarships**: grants are available for up to 3 months for all eligible students, subject to availability of funds. Monthly allowance for 2024/25: €300.

FACULTY-LED PROGRAMMES

Available in person/online



Faculty-led programmes offer an intensive and flexible learning experience abroad, guided by a professor from your own university.



Who can apply

Students enrolled in specific Bachelor's or Master's degree courses for which the programme is activated.



Application and start dates

Dates vary depending on the destination.



Key Benefits

- **Highly targeted** and **well-structured** programmes
- **Fully integrated** into the academic curriculum
- Opportunity to **explore in depth topics** covered during your studies
- Classroom sessions enriched with complementary activities such as **company visits, workshops, and cultural initiatives**
- Possibility to have **credits officially recognised** and access scholarships

MODEL UNITED NATIONS

Available in person



The Model United Nations programme, organised in partnership with MUN-Italia (part of the MUN-Europe network), offers students the chance to take part in United Nations simulations.

The simulations are preceded by an online or in-person training course led by experts in the field.



Who can apply

Students interested in learning more about how international organisations work and in developing skills useful for their academic and professional careers.



When to apply

The programme takes place several times during the year. Places are limited, so early registration is recommended.

Applications must be submitted directly via the official website: www.mun-italia.it



When do simulations take place

Sessions are held in various European and US cities, between 2025 and 2026 (e.g. Brussels, Berlin, Malta, Paris, Rome, Washington DC & New York).

Updated dates are available on the official website.



Key benefits

- Gain **first-hand knowledge** of how the United Nations works
- **Develop transferable skills:** public speaking, negotiation, teamwork, and problem-solving
- **Strengthen key academic skills:** research, analysis, and academic writing
- Enjoy an **immersive experience** in an international environment

CUSTOMISED INTERNSHIP

Available in person



The Customised Internship programme, in partnership with international providers, offers students the opportunity to take part in an international internship lasting 8 to 12 weeks in cities around the world, with the possibility of credit recognition.

Destinations include Europe, the United States, Asia, Latin America, and Australia.



Who can apply

- Open to students and recent graduates (up to 12 months after graduation) from all Faculties.
- No previous work experience in the chosen field is required
- B2 level of English is required
- Only some destinations require an official IELTS certificate



When to apply

The programme is offered four times a year, and applications must be submitted approximately three months before the chosen start date:

- For departures in March/April: apply by December
- For departures in June/July: apply by March
- For departures in September/October: apply by June
- For departures in December/January: apply by September



Start dates and programme duration

Internships last 8 or 12 weeks, depending on the student's choice.

Possible start periods: September/October, March/April, and June/July.



Key Benefits

- **Scholarships available**, awarded on the basis of academic merit
- **Freedom to choose** your field, city, and preferred period
- Opportunity to work in **small and medium-sized enterprises**
- Possibility to have **credits officially recognised** as a **curricular internship**
- Chance to take part in a **real recruitment process** with international companies and gain **professional experience before graduation**
- **All-inclusive package**: pre-departure orientation and support, CV and interview preparation, dedicated assistance during the internship application and approval process, 24/7 emergency contact, health insurance and Safety App for the duration of the programme, accommodation arrangements, and local support

DUBLIN

English Course + Customised Internship

Available in person



This programme combines an English course at the **Emerald Cultural Institute** in Dublin with an 8-week customised internship in the student's chosen area of interest.

Each student can choose their preferred English course from those offered by the Emerald Cultural Institute, as well as the field in which to complete their internship.



Who can apply

Open to all students and recent graduates (up to 12 months after graduation) from all Faculties.

Particularly suitable for students who have not yet reached a B2 level of English, normally required for participation in internship programmes.

A minimum English level of B1 is required.



When to apply

Applications are always open. The application must be completed at least 8 weeks before the start of the course.



Start dates and programme duration

English courses start every Monday.

The overall programme lasts 3 months: 1 month of English classes followed by 2 months of internship.



Key Benefits

- Possibility to **combine** in a single programme a **language component** and a **customised internship**, and experience living in Dublin both as a student and as an intern
- **Flexibility**: no fixed start dates – choose when to go
- Possibility of **credit recognition** as a curricular internship
- **Scholarships available** for all selected students, subject to funding availability. Amount for 2024/25: €1,000
- The programme fee includes a **comprehensive package**: pre-departure orientation and support, CV and interview preparation guidance, assistance before departure, help with activating the internship and credit approval procedure, English course (minimum 4 weeks), internship in the chosen field, accommodation in a residence or host family, 24/7 emergency contact, health insurance and Safety App for the entire duration of the programme

STEP PORTAL

Available in person/online



The STEP Portal is a platform for finding and activating internships abroad.

It allows students to browse and apply to a range of opportunities published by Cattolica International's partner companies.

Each internship offer is characterised by the criteria of the individual host company, including timing, required academic background, language skills, and whether the internship is on site or remote.

Through the STEP Portal, it is also possible to activate an international internship opportunity that students have found independently.



Who can apply

Open to all students and recent graduates (up to 12 months after graduation) from all Faculties.



When to apply

Applications are always open, as companies post opportunities at different times of the year.

It is recommended to apply at least one month before the planned start date of the internship.



Start dates and programme duration

Start dates vary depending on the individual offer, and internships usually last between 3 and 6 months.



Key benefits

- **Reliable**: choose from opportunities offered by companies already in partnership with Cattolica International, or activate an independently found internship
- **Scholarships available** to support selected students
- Possibility of **credit recognition** as a curricular internship
- You can **apply for multiple internships** at the same time
- Option to **repeat the experience** more than once
- **Italian Chambers of Commerce Network**: apply for an internship at one of the many Italian Chambers of Commerce around the world, with excellent placement opportunities
- **Some** internships are **also available remotely**

MAECI - CRUI INTERNSHIP

Available in person/online



The MAECI-CRUI programme is the result of a collaboration between the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation (MAECI) and the Ministry of Universities and Research (MUR).

It offers 3-month internships at Embassies, Diplomatic Representations, Consulates, and Italian Cultural Institutes around the world.

Internships can be carried out either in person or remotely.



Who can apply

- Open to Italian citizens under 29 years of age, enrolled in a Master's or single-cycle Master's degree programme.
- B2 level of English required
- Minimum average grade of 27/30 required
- Access to each destination is also subject to degree class requirements



When to apply

Calls for applications are published 3 times a year, for internships starting in January, May, and September.



Start dates

January, May, and September.



Key benefits

- Possibility of **credit recognition** as a curricular internship
- **Scholarships available** for all selected students. Monthly grant for 2024/25: €300
- **Some destinations** also offer the option of **completing the internship online**
- Opportunity to gain **first-hand knowledge** of the **work** carried out by **embassies, diplomatic missions, consular offices, and Italian Cultural Institutes** by assisting with event organisation, research, analysis, and preparation of documents on issues relevant to the host country

VIS MOOT

Diplomatic simulations and arbitration



The programme selects a team of students to represent the University at the Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot.

The Vis Moot is a prestigious international competition in which students compete in a simulated international arbitration case. The competition is based on a complex practical case requiring the resolution of issues in arbitration law and international sales of goods.



Who can apply

Open to students enrolled in the single-cycle degree in Law.

Minimum English level required: B2.



When can I apply

Applications open in June.



When does it take place

The competition lasts 6 months. During this time, the team prepares written memoranda and later presents oral arguments in Vienna in April, before arbitral panels composed of academics and professionals.



Key benefits

- The Vis Moot is a **unique opportunity** in the Italian university system
- **Hands-on experience** with a **practical case**
- **Improvement** of legal analysis and teamwork skills
- Opportunity to **strengthen sector-specific English**, both written and oral
- Award of **5 ECTS credits**
- **Scholarships** available for all selected students

PAX MOOT

Available in person



The programme selects a team of students to represent the University at the PAX Moot, an international competition in private international law that simulates a trial.

During the 5-month programme, selected students are required to actively participate in regular preparation meetings, contributing to team work and case development.



Who can apply

Open to students enrolled in the single-cycle degree in Law.

Minimum English level required: B2.



When can I apply

Applications open in November.



Key dates

The PAX Moot begins with the release of the case in November and is divided into a written and an oral phase:

- Written phase: Students study the case and carry out legal research to draft written memoranda. The team prepares submissions for both sides of the case (Claimant and Respondent), to be submitted around mid-March.
- Oral phase: After the written phase, oral pleadings take place at an international venue (to be determined). The hearings are usually held in April or May.



Key benefits

- Opportunity to work on a practical case raising complex legal issues, collaborating within the team and with teams from universities around the world
- Chance to improve legal analysis and argumentation skills and strengthen English proficiency (both written and oral)
- Award of 4 ECTS credits
- Scholarships available for all selected students

JESSUP INTERNATIONAL LAW MOOT COURT COMPETITION

Available in person



The programme selects a team of students to represent the University at the Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition, a prestigious public international law competition involving more than 600 universities from over 100 countries each year.

Students compete in a simulation of international litigation before the International Court of Justice, based on a complex practical case requiring the resolution of issues in public international law.



Who can apply

Open to students enrolled in the single-cycle degree in Law.

Minimum English level required: B2.



When can I apply

Applications open in September.



Key dates

The Jessup Competition begins with the release of the case in September and is divided into a written and an oral phase:

- Written phase: Students study the case and conduct legal research to draft written memoranda. The team must prepare submissions for both sides (Applicant and Respondent), to be submitted by mid-January.
- Oral phase: After the written phase, the team participates in the Italian National Round in February. The winning team advances to Washington, D.C. to compete against the other national champions.



Key benefits

- The Jessup Competition is a unique opportunity within the Italian university system
- Experience with a practical case, enhancing skills in legal analysis and teamwork
- Opportunity to strengthen specialised legal English, both written and oral
- Award of 5 ECTS credits
- Scholarships available for all selected students

MANFRED LACHS SPACE LAW MOOT COURT COMPETITION

Available in person



The Manfred Lachs Space Law Moot Court Competition, organised by the International Institute of Space Law, engages universities from all over the world and is based on a practical case in international space law.

Founded in 1992, the competition involves dozens of student teams each year, representing five global regions: North America, Europe, Asia-Pacific, Africa, and Latin America.



Who can apply

Open to students enrolled in the single-cycle degree in Law.
Minimum English level required: B2.

Applications open in June.

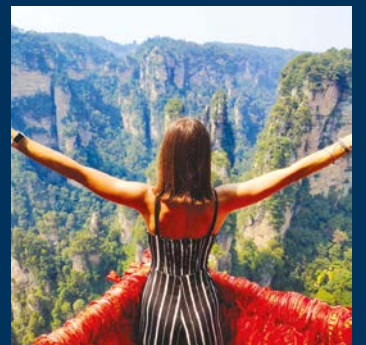
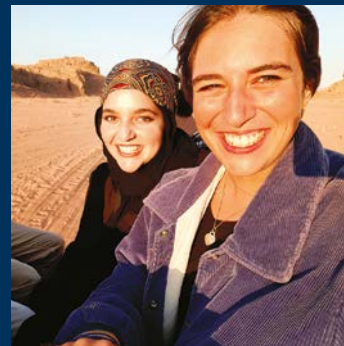
