

SELDa computer-based English exam (B1 & B1+) - 60 minutes

Format: 3 parts

1. Listening
2. Reading
3. Use of English

Listening: 2 parts: 12 questions – 12 points

- Part 2: 1 longer passage with gap fill exercise (6 gaps)
- Part 3: 1 longer passage with multiple choice exercise (6 questions)

Reading: 3 parts : 16 questions – 16 points

- Part 1: 4 multiple choice questions (notices and messages)
- Part 2: reading with multiple choice questions (longer passage)
- Part 3: Jumbled text (5 points)

Use of English: 3 parts: 22 questions

- Part 1: cloze test (10 gaps)
- Part 2: sentence transformation
- Part 3: “Word formation” – gapped sentences

Total Listening, Reading and Use of English: 50 questions – 50 points

Pass mark:

Livello B1+: 30/50 – 60%;

Livello B1: 27/50– 55%

Selda English Oral Exam – Level B1 & B1+

Format:

- in pairs, approx. 12 minutes per pair
- four parts

Part 1:

Introduction and personal information:

- 1) Candidates introduce themselves
- 2) Candidates are asked to spell their name/surname

Part 2:

Conversation between the candidates on one of the topics present in the programme.

Part 3:

Describe a picture provided by the lecturer.

Part 4:

Provide a definition of some words present in the textbook.

B1+: students of the **Faculty of Psychology** are also asked to know and comment on the texts present in the Dispensa Selda Lingua Orale Facoltà di Psicologia.

Oral exam for Lingua inglese per il turismo 1 (Scienze turistiche e valorizzazione del territorio)

Part 1:

Students will have to prepare a Power Point presentation where they describe a tourist destination of their choice (considering *how to get there, types of accomodation, what to see, what to do, climate, ...*).

Part 2:

The examiner will show students some *visuals*: starting from the visuals students will have to describe some destinations, using the specific vocabulary presented in class, trying to convince a potential tourist to choose that destination.

Part 3:

Students will complete some *role-plays* on topics dealt with during the course.
