OPT and CPT



- CPT is available as a course and is offered as a part of certain certificate programs that are over 3 quarters in length.
- Post-Completion Optional Practical Training (OPT) is employment authorization approved by U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) for eligible F-1 students interested in engaging in employment in the U.S. directly related to their field of study after their certificate completion.
- F-1 students are eligible for an initial 12 months of OPT per educational level achieved.
- Applicants do not need an employment offer to apply for OPT.

Study Abroad at UCLA



The Study Abroad at UCLA Program is designed for international students who want to experience life at a top-ranked university in Los Angeles, California.

You can:

- **Earn academic credit you can transfer to a university**
- Enroll with flexibility: 3, 6, 9 months, or one year
- Take classes across multiple academic departments
- **Study side by side with students from the U.S., working professionals, and other international**



Study Abroad Curriculum



- **UCLA Extension operates on the quarter system:**
 - **Winter (January)**
 - **Spring (April)**
 - **Summer (June)**
 - **Fall (September)**
- **Students enroll in at least 12 units each quarter**
- **Select from undergraduate and graduate courses taught at UCLA Extension**
- **Undergraduate coursework at UCLA main campus may be available on a limited basis**



Course Information



XL 1 to XL 199

Equivalent to undergraduate courses offered by UCLA; transferable for unit and subject credit toward the Bachelor's Degree at all UC campuses. 1 - 99 are lower division, 100 - 199 are upper division.

X 1 to X 199

Structured in accordance with requirements for UCLA undergraduate courses, but include subject matter not part of the undergraduate curriculum. Not exactly equivalent but transferrable for Bachelor's Degree at all UC campuses. Subject credit is determined by major department.



Course Information



X 400 to X 499

Generally post-baccalaureate credit-bearing courses and lectures in professional fields, designed to standards of instruction used in professional-level degree programs. Academic credit may lead to certificate at UCLA Extension and may be transferrable for advanced standing in degree programs, subject to the receiving institution.

UCLA Courses

If you want to enroll in fall, winter, or spring UCLA courses, you must select undergraduate courses offered by select UCLA colleges. Course offerings include a wide variety of courses in the Humanities, Life Sciences, Physical Sciences, and Social Sciences.

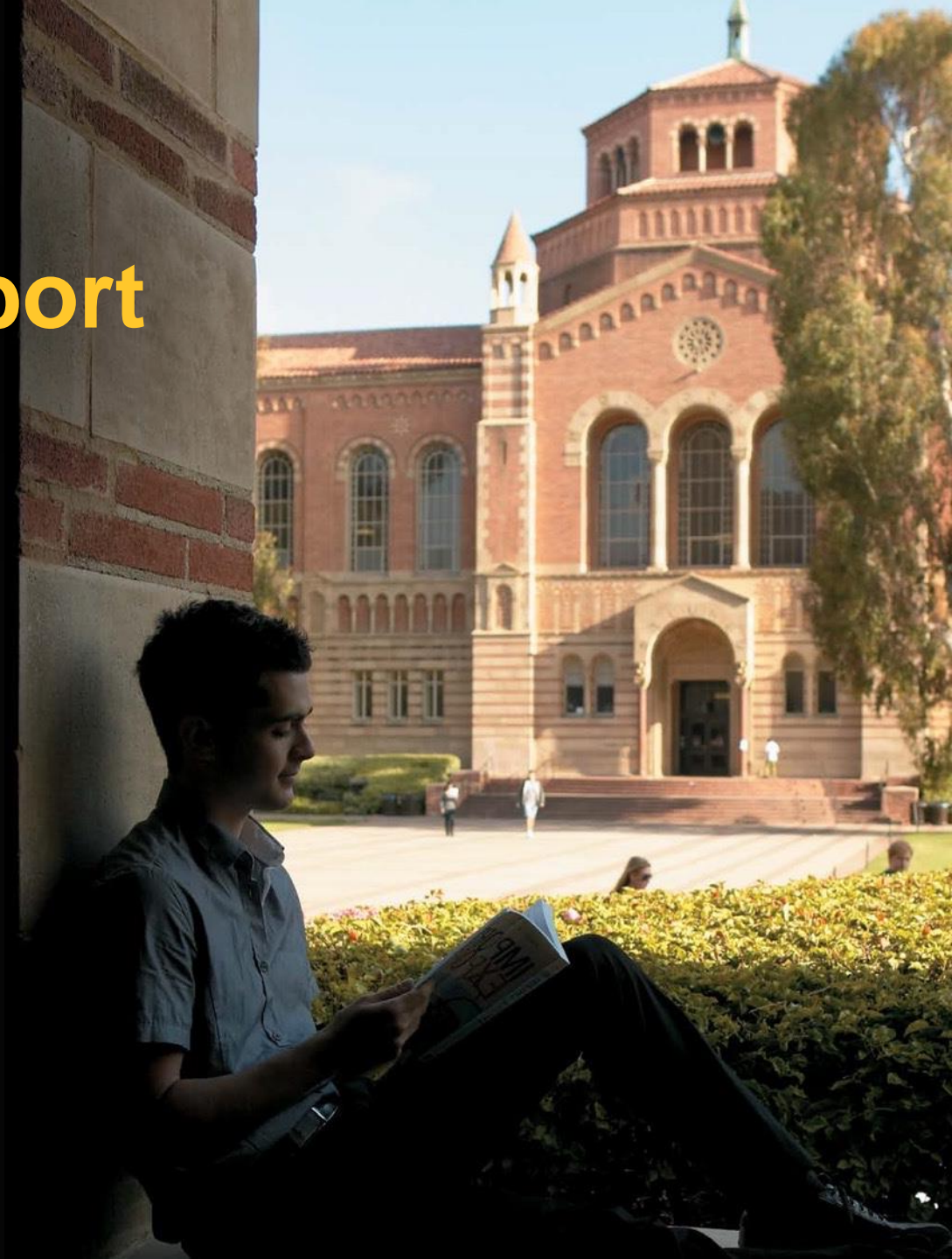

- 18+ years of age
- Program prerequisites: none needed
- English language requirements:
 - TOEFL: 80 (iBT)
 - IELTS: 6.5
 - iTEP: 5.0
 - Cambridge: C1 or C2
 - CEFR: C1
 - Duolingo (DET): 115
 - DAAD: 3/B2
 - GEPT: High intermediate
 - TOEIC: 685



Application Requirements: Study Abroad at UCLA



- 18+ years of age
- Degree requirements: high school diploma; at least 2.5 GPA for UCLA Extension; 3.0 for UCLA Main Campus
- Program prerequisites: varies by class
- English language requirements:
